Went to post at 4:00. At post 4 minutes. Start straggling. Won in a canter; second driving. Delhi shot into a lont lead after going the first quarter and nothing ever got near enough to seriously menace him thereafter and received a perfect ride. Graziello maintained a forward position from the start and improved it in the long stretch run with splendid courage, looming up momentarily midway of the stretch and beat the others off for second place. Rapid Water, evidently not keyed up for such a bruising race, was reserved in the early running, closing up well, but boring out and tired at the end. This race should fit him and he should beat good ones later on. Conjurer, nearly left, closed a tremendous gap in three furlongs, looming up a dangerous factor when straightened out for home, but tired badly in the closing drive. The Southerner, hopelessly outrun, finished fast as usual. Leonidas was prominent for a mile and failed to stay and was easing up at the end. He is undersized and has not trained on.
