Start bad and slow. Won handily; second and third driving. Crusader raced prominently from the start and, coming fast through the stretch, passed Haste and held Espino safe in the final drive. Espino was left at the post, but closed an immense gap and ran a great race. Haste forced the pace and passed Rock Man when called on, but tired badly at the end. Display raced well and saved ground where possible and had no mishap. Rock Man set a good pace for a mile and ran a good race throughout. Mars tired. Rock Star was left at the post and was not persevered with when he tired. Banton and Macaw were eased up at the end.
