Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third same. Peace Chance, fractious at the post and taken to the outside, followed the pace under restraint and, going to the outside of the leader entering the stretch, drew away. High Quest, rated along in front under restraint, saved ground throughout, but tired in the final eighth. Good Goods improved his position steadily when called upon, but did not menace the leaders. Gay Monarch, outrun to the far turn, moved up and outlasted Rose Cross. The latter tired after moving up on the far turn. Chicstraw tired when called upon after being under early restraint. Roustabout could not keep up. Sir Thomas, close up early, was bothered near the far turn and tired.
