By subscription of \$100 each, to accompany the nomination; \$1,000 to pass the entry box; \$2,000 to start. A Supplementary nomination of \$5,000 may be made on Wednesday, June 3 with an additional \$15,000 to start, with \$200,000 added of which 60% to the winner, 22% to second, 12% to third and 6% to fourth. The winning owner will be presented with the August Belmont Memorial Cup to be retained for one year as well as a trophy for permanent possession and trophies will be presented to the winning trainer and jockey and mementoes to the grooms of the first four finishers. Nominations closed Tuesday, February 17, 1981 with 343 nominations. Supplementary nominee: Paristo.

SUMMING, reserved into the backstretch, moved through along the inside to take over while still well in hand just after going six furlongs, sprinted away when ready when leaving the far turn, settled into the stretch with a good lead and turned back HIGHLAND BLADE under strong handling. The latter, unhurried while being outrun into the backstretch, settled suddenly approaching the far turn, raced wide into the stretch while rallying and finished strongly. PLEASANT COLONY, fractious at the gate, was outrun into the backstretch, quickly reached contention while racing well out in the track nearing the far turn, remained a bit wide into the stretch and finished with good energy. WOODCHOPPER passed tired horses while racing wide. ESCAMBIA BAY, well placed into the backstretch, made a run between horses nearing the far turn but was finished after going nine furlongs. TAP SHOES moved up between horses approaching the end of the backstretch but gave way soon after going a mile. PARISTO, in hand early, split horses to gain a momentary advantage midway along the backstretch but was finished soon after going a mile. BARE KNUCKLES stumbled slightly after the start, recovered quickly to show speed into the backstretch and tired badly. SEZYOU tired badly from his early efforts. STAGE DOOR KEY, prominent into the backstretch, stopped badly. BOLD EGO, a forward factor until near the end of the backstretch, stopped badly.
